From Lawn to Meadow - part 3.

Our lockdown project was to change our rather weedy lawn to a wildflower meadow. Things have not gone smoothly, but it has given me something to aim for. Having prepared the area by cutting the grass short and raking out the moss, the purchased seed mix was sown. Cue the weather to give us very hot and dry weeks, when rain followed it was heavy and the temperature fell, and then there were the thunderstorms and extreme winds. No seedlings seemed to sprout for weeks, so I resorted to sowing in compost in pots and transplanting the seedlings when big enough. Since then some seedlings have appeared, but frustratingly just one (common vetch) has flowered. The others have clumps of leaves, and I am hoping they are perennials and will overwinter and flower next year.

All was not lost though, as simply leaving the lawn uncut after that first cut has revealed that a number of plants were already in the lawn but just not flowering due to frequent mowing. Of course dandelions and daisies had always appeared, but now other things appeared in sequence over the weeks. Purple violets mingled with blue germander speedwell, then spotted medick and black medick showed their tiny yellow flowers. A single pink herb robert flowered at the same time as the red clover, plus a purple deadnettle and a white deadnettle. Then it was time for the purple selfheal and white clover. Taller plants were the white yarrow which have been in flower for weeks but now forming seedheads, and the yellow common cat's ear and the orange hawkbit or 'fox & cubs'.

I'll have to weed out some of the last two as they are invasive and will out-compete other plants.

Now I'm cutting back the grass again around the clumps of wildflowers as the wet weather has meant it has grown fast. I'll also need to rake out the dead thatch and the moss that I see is growing again, so that



I can make a further sowing of the wildflower mixes. I'm hopeful that next year we will see more of the wildflowers. **Ann Chapman**




